VARSITY SQUASH WINS INTER-AC TITLE

Varsity squash captured the Inter-Ac title for the fourth consecutive year and the MASA title for the third consecutive year. The team earned a #2 national ranking entering the U.S. Squash High School National Tournament. The team amassed 99 wins and only six losses this season.

'ONE IS SILVER AND THE OTHER, GOLD'

Baldwin Crew makes a splash on local, regional and national waters

Baldwin Crew had another outstanding season, capturing a total of seven gold, one silver and two bronze medals in local, regional and national regattas.

Baldwin's lightweight double of Madison Noteware '12 and Allison Hoeltzel '10 won a silver medal at the USRowing Youth National Championships in Cincinnati, OH on June 13 with a time of 8:00.509 on the 2,000-meter course. First place went to Lake Union from Seattle, WA and third was Pocock Rowing Center, also from Seattle. The field included 20 boats from schools and clubs across the nation, all of whom had to qualify for the USRowing Championship at regional regattas. Baldwin's double was one of only two Philadelphia area crews to medal at the national championships.

The double's silver medal capped off an exciting season for Hoeltzel and Noteware, who won gold in the event at the 84th annual Stotesbury Cup Regatta, the world's largest high school regatta, on May 15 as well as at the Scholastic Rowing Association of America (SRAA) Championships May 29 in Saratoga Springs, NY, the New Jersey Scholastic Championships May 22 and the Philadelphia Scholastic Rowing Association (PSRA) Championships May 2.

Adding to the gold medal count was the junior double of Tess Candell '11 and Kaylah Kleczka '12, who were the victors at both the New Jersey Scholastic Championships and the PSRA Championships.

Also winning gold this season was Denise Cirelli '11 who won the ergometer race for singles in the annual Dr. Robert White Novice and Freshman Regatta

sponsored by the PSRA May 9. Cirelli was entered in the singles event, which was canceled due to high winds. In lieu of the race, the singles rowers competed in an indoor 1,500 kilometer ergometer race. Cirelli won the girls division with a time of 6:05.

The two bronze medals were captured at the New Jersey Scholastic Championships by the senior double of team captains, Gabrielle Amundson '10 and Alison Callegari '10, and the junior quad composed of Elizabeth Asch '12, Natalie Webb '12, Ally Kontra '11 and Charlotte Beever '13.

Senior Sloan Warren signs with UVA

Senior Sloan Warren, a six-year varsity lacrosse standout at Baldwin, has signed a National Letter of Intent to accept a scholarship and to play lacrosse for the University of Virginia. The signing took place at Baldwin Nov. 10, 2010 with Warren's family, varsity teammates, coaches, and friends in attendance.

A varsity starter since seventh grade, Warren has led Baldwin in goals, assists, ground ball controls, draw controls and points since her freshman year and has set school records in goals scored and points earned (494 since eighth grade.) She recorded over 100 goals her freshman and junior years and 99 her sophomore year. As a junior, Warren posted 109 goals, an average of 6.8 goals per game and was named team MVP. She has garnered numerous lacrosse awards, including being named All-American her junior year and chosen as a Heather Leigh Albert Award finalist in 2009. She was named to the U.S. Lacrosse National Tournament Upper Atlantic Team 1 in 2009, the Under Armour All-American Philadelphia All Star Team in 2009 and 2010, the PhillyLacrosse.com First Team, and the All-Inter-Ac League First Team and All-Main Line First Team every year since she was a freshman.

Warren, who also plays basketball and soccer at Baldwin, is a US Lacrosse Academic All-American, a National Merit Commended Student, president of the Baldwin Athletic Association, and head of the Baldwin's Model Congress and Mock Trial Team. At UVA, she will study in the Darden School of Business.
